3. What are the primary reasons for your preference?

Many reasons - overall look and feel, new outdoor cushioned tennis courts, spread out of traffic - people and cars

Sense of Entry. Prefer the front of the building addressing the Entry and parking of the complex. Also like that existing outdoor pickleball gets to stay intact and operational during construction.

Access seems better

The revised plan is focused on the whole facility vs original plan being just the expansion of Pickleball

Player safety addressed in Revised. The layout is better.

The revised plan will be less expensive to build, the parking will be much more convenient, there will be 8 outdoor pickleball courts instead of 6, the common area in the revised plan can be utilized by both tennis and pickleball, and two brand new hard court tennis courts will be built to replace two asphalt tennis courts that are failing.

The information is incorrect- there are 8 outdoor courts now, not 6, so it's a loss of 2 tennis courts. The problem with only having 6 indoor tennis courts and 6 outdoor tennis courts is that there is no place where there is 8 tennis courts. 8 courts are needed for tournaments and high school tennis.

No full summer outdoor PB disruption. 2 more outdoor courts. More room indoors for Mezzanine and side space. Revised plan less expensive.
